## Top Ten Outcomes for DukeEngage 2012









- 10. DukeEngage creates social networks of students and faculty that develop during programs and projects, and persist upon return to campus.
- 9. Six months after DukeEngage, more than 75% of students had incorporated their experience into their writing, including academic papers, job and graduate school applications, and blogs.\*
- 8. More than 40% of students found their DukeEngage program or project made them more confident.
- 7. More than 85% of students report that they gained collaborative skills as a result of serving on a team during their program or project.
- 6. Six months after DukeEngage, more than 75% of students found that their experience influenced their thoughts about a future career.\*
- 5. DukeEngage students reflect and build upon their experience in scholarly forums around campus; students participate in panel and group discussions, and attend lectures and presentations around topics and themes similar to their program or project.\*
- 4. More than 75% of students report their program or project experience had a great impact on them.
- 3. Given the opportunity, more than 90% of participants would choose to repeat their program or project.
- 2. DukeEngage leads students to refine their academic plans; students emerge from programs and projects more certain about issues they would like to explore in their classes and through their majors, minors and certificate programs.
- 1. More than 90% of community partner supervisors report that they would partner with DukeEngage students again the future, while 90% of students report their service had a tangible impact on host communities.\*
